Cochise County Fair, General Rules & Regulations, 2022

1. Exhibit Entry Requirements

- A. No entry fees are charged for exhibits except for those entered in Department K – Poultry, Pigeons and Rabbits. Fees for each are listed in the department section of the Premium Book.
- B. Entry forms for all departments except 4-H are available at the fairgrounds. Entry forms for 4-H may be obtained from the Cochise County Extension Offices in Willcox or Sierra Vista.
- C. Exhibitors for all departments except for Livestock, Poultry, Pigeons and Rabbits must obtain an entry number from the Secretary of Exhibits Office in the Agriculture Building prior to submitting the entry form and exhibit to the Department Superintendent.
- D. The times for entering exhibits are listed under the specific department sections in the Premium Book. Any exhibit submitted after the deadline may be accepted for exhibit only, provided the Superintendent determines there is sufficient space; however, such exhibits will not be judged.
- E. Except in the Photography, Poultry, Pigeons and Rabbits Departments, no one may submit more than one entry in each lot, although an individual may compete in as many lots as desired. No exhibit from the previous year's Fair may be submitted unless there has been a significant subsequent modification or addition to the exhibit. Each entry must have been raised, produced or created as an exhibit by the exhibitor. *Except for the FFA, Education, and 4-H departments, exhibit entries may have been raised, produced or created in Cochise County or any county in the United States that touches Cochise County, including Greenlee, Graham, Santa Cruz, Pima, and Hidalgo (NM) counties.* Entries must have been completed within 12 months prior to the opening date of the Fair. Upon request of the Department Superintendent, an exhibitor may be required to certify compliance with these rules as a condition of entry. **A Superintendent who, for any reason, deems an entry unsatisfactory, may refuse to accept it.**
- F. Exhibits must be picked up between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. on Sunday, the last day of the Fair. An exhibit which remains on the Fairgrounds after 6 p.m. on Sunday may be disposed of by the Department Superintendent in any manner deemed appropriate or convenient.
- G. **While the Fair Association tries to take reasonable care of exhibits, the Fair is not responsible for breakage, loss or damage, and each exhibitor assumes the risk of possible breakage, loss or damage as a condition of exhibiting an item.**

2. Judging

- A. Scheduled times for judging for each department are noted in that department's section of the Premium Book.
- B. Judges shall be qualified and unbiased. No one may be a judge and an exhibitor in the same class.
- C. The public may observe the judging, but may not talk to or interfere with a Judge while judging is in progress. The Superintendent and Judge may limit the number of observers if space is limited.

3. Prizes and Awards

- A. Prizes shall be awarded exclusively on the basis of exhibit merit, and sole entries shall not be entitled to an award unless they meet judging standards.
- B. A premium ribbon will be attached to each winning entry by the Department Superintendent or Judge. Awards will be made as follows:

First Premium	Blue Ribbon
Second Premium	Red Ribbon
Third Premium	White Ribbon

- C. In some departments, awards are offered for the best and largest number of exhibits presented by any one person in a specific department. The recipients of those awards will be determined by the point system.

Superintendent:

Entries will be received on Wednesday, September 21 from 10 a.m. until 8 p.m. and on Thursday, September 22, from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m., at which time judging will begin. In any class with lot "Any other variety," more than one entry may be made in that lot provided each variety is named. If three or more entries by different exhibitors are made and named in this lot, a new lot will be added so that exhibits may be judged in their own category. Exhibits must be picked up at 5 p.m. on Sunday, September 25, but absolutely NOT BEFORE 5 p.m. Unclaimed items will remain at the Fairgrounds for a limited number of days. Fair personnel are not responsible for unclaimed items.

Field Crops: Be sure that the variety is written on the exhibitor's tags and make entry sheet and tags correspond to lot and class. For ears, stalks, or heads, enter five (5) each. Enter one (1) pint each of seeds or grains. Sheaves should not be less than two inches, nor more than five inches in diameter. Heads must have stems not more nor less than four inches and are not to be tied.

Apiary: Exhibitors may use their own labels or affix their name and lot # to the bottom of the jar or package. However, for judging purposes, one jar or package in each lot must have no label other than the identification tag. All containers must be clean and of uniform size. All honey must be in marketable shape and free of foreign matter. All combs must be new combs wrapped in heavy cellophane or be in a single frame observation hive.

Superintendent:

Entries will be received on Wednesday, September 21, from 10 a.m. until 8 p.m. and on Thursday, September 22, from 7 until 9 a.m. Please make out your entry blank and have your exhibits in early. Judging starts at 9 a.m. on Thursday September 22. Any entry by a Youth exhibitor (18 years & under) may be made in any lot by adding the letter "J" to the lot #. Apples, pears, pomegranates, figs & quinces MUST HAVE ¼" to ½" STEM AND NO LEAVES. Uniformity in size, shape, and color is important. Exhibits must be picked up at 5 p.m. on Sunday, September 25, but absolutely NOT BEFORE 5 p.m. Unclaimed items will remain at the Fairgrounds for a limited number of days. Fair personnel are not responsible for unclaimed items.

Aromatic Display: Plants should be displayed in vases and have an agreeable odor or fragrance. Entries will be judged primarily on fragrance rather than look. Vases should be as full as practical.

End Use Display: All herbs should be processed properly for intended use (e.g. vinegar, salve), be in appropriate containers, and of sufficient quantity.

PREMIUM AWARDS: First place \$3.00 Second place \$2.00

SWEEPSTAKE AWARDS: Best and largest number of entries grown and exhibited by one person. Computed on the point system. **First place \$6.00 Second place \$4.00**

Superintendents:

Non-perishable entries will be received Wednesday, September 21 from 10 a.m. until 8 p.m. Perishable entries will be received on Thursday, September 22 from 7 until 9 a.m. Please make out your entry blanks and have your exhibit in early. Judging starts at 9 a.m. on Thursday, September 22.

Vegetable entries must contain the amount, number of fruits or number of commercial bunches specified in an entry Lot.

One individual may make no more than one entry in any lot. Items of a closely similar form will be considered to be the same lot. One person may enter only one of the items. Bunches must be banded together. An incorrect number of items will disqualify the entry. In any lot listed as "Any other variety," more than one entry may be made in that Lot, provided each variety is different and named. An exhibitor must place the letters A, B, C, D, etc. after a lot #, for each entry under "Any other variety." If three or more entries are made and named in a lot by different exhibitors, a new lot will be added so that exhibits may be judged in their own category. Be sure that the "variety" is written on the exhibitor's tag. When you enter heavy squash, pumpkins and watermelons under Class 19 and the appropriate lot #, the heaviest is automatically selected for the Special Awards and no extra entry is necessary. If you know the weight, make a note on the entry tag. The decision of the judge is final in all cases. Exhibits must be picked up at 5 p.m. on Sunday, September 26, but absolutely NOT BEFORE 5 p.m. Unclaimed items will remain at the Fairgrounds for a limited number of days. Fair personnel are not responsible for unclaimed items.

Exhibits must be picked up at 5 p.m. on Sunday, September 25, but absolutely NOT BEFORE 5 p.m. Unclaimed items will remain at the Fairgrounds for a limited number of days. Fair personnel are not responsible for unclaimed items.

GENERAL FLORICULTURE DEPARTMENT RULES:

1. Competition is open to all amateur growers and arrangers.
2. Entry tags will be provided and must accompany each and every entry. Write the entry tag number for each item on the entry form, under description.
3. **All entries are to be clean and insect free.** Judges have the right to disqualify any exhibit, which does not conform to this schedule.
4. Exhibitors are allowed unlimited entries in each lot if each is a separate named variety, type, or color. Lots will be divided as entries warrant. All will be judged variety against variety.
5. Any entry by a youth exhibitor (18 years and under) may be made in any lot by adding the letter “**J**” to the lot # for **ages up to 11**, or “**JS**” for **ages 12-18**.
6. **Exhibitors must furnish their own containers, which should be presentable. The vase or container can be used to enhance the presentation.**

Containers: If using a jar, the labels must be covered or removed. Containers must be leak proof and sturdy enough to support the display. The size should fit the entry in depth and width, and be adjusted to prevent spilling or slipping of flowers. **Example: Don't use a tall, wide-mouth containers to hold 3 small stems. No paper cups or soft plastic containers will be accepted.** The Fair Association will not assume responsibility for breakage.

Artistic Arrangements: Arrangements using artificial flowers or foliage will not be accepted. Dried materials may be sprayed or colored.

Labeling: All tags and entry sheets must be filled out before submitting material. **Be sure that the variety is written on the tag.** The Fair will reserve the right to remove any exhibit at any time that its appearance is unsuited to remain on exhibit.

Conditioning Plant Material – All fresh plant material should be conditioned several hours before exhibiting or arranging. Specimens should be cut in late afternoon or early morning. A sharp knife or clippers should be used to cut stem on a long slant for the greatest intake of water. Cut specimens should be placed in a vessel of deep tepid water in a cool, dark place for several hours or overnight. **For additional information contact the Floriculture Superintendent** (phone number above).

Judging: Each flower has its own criteria, but still must meet the same 4 factor headings. They will be:

- “Presentation” to show the uniformity and positioning of the flowers for the best presentation.
- “Grooming” to show no burnt, insect damaged, or dead parts.
- “Healthy Foliage” is to be left on to determine the health of the plant.
- “Flowers”. If the lot calls for 3 stems-- 3 flowers should be completely open but not in their last stage. Flowers should be as uniform as possible with the same size, shape, color, and scent.

Potted plants should have good looking soil and not be too root bound. Pots should be clean and have basins. The top of the soil should be no further down than 2” below top edge of pot, and no nursery pots larger than a 2 gal. size.

Please fill in your entry form and individual exhibitor's tags. These may be secured from the Department Superintendents or at the Exhibit Office in the Agriculture Building.

Youth or students: Any entry by a Youth exhibitor (18 years or younger) may be made in any class and lot by adding the letter "J" to the lot #. All youth must add a "J" after each lot # or, the entry will be judged in the Adult Division. If entries are commercially or professionally done, mark "C" on entry tag and jar label.

All fruits and vegetables must be in standard pint and quart jars or 4, 6 and 8 oz. jars. Dried fruits and vegetables should be in standard pint or quart jars. Jelly must be in jars with lids, no paraffin wax and must be sealed. Entries in classes 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, and 39 will be opened by judges for testing. All entries must be labeled as to contents, method of canning, (water bath or pressure) and dates canned. Jar caps and rings should be clean, without rust. Outside of jar should be clean, not sticky. Contents, except for meats, should be covered by liquid and should not touch lid. Proper seal is important.

FRUITS: Uniformity of pack and ripeness is very important. The ripeness determines the color and texture of the fruit. The syrup or liquid should be clear, not cloudy, and should cover the contents.

VEGETABLES: Here again the liquid is very important. It must be clear and cover the vegetables.

PICKLES/RELISHES: All cucumbers and mixed pickles must be firm and crisp. Sweet pickles firms, yet tender, don't overcook. Again natural color of product used, clearness of liquid and uniformity of pack is important. Liquid should cover contents. Flavor is a vital factor in this class. In pickling fruits, don't get them too sweet. Vegetables should not be too sour or over spiced.

JAMS/CONSERVES: Do not sieve or strain. True jams resemble crushed fruit with no separation of fruit and juice. Natural fruit flavor should be preserved. Jams should not be rubbery.

JELLIES/MARMALADES: Jelly must be transparent and have good texture (quiver) and color. It should maintain the natural fruit flavor, without crystals. Write on the entry the type of fruit used.

PRESERVES: The color and flavor must be natural to the fruit. Syrup should be clear and thick, the pieces of fruit firm and whole.

MEATS: Broth should come to 1" from top. Meat should be packed consistently. Meats must be pressure canned.

BUTTERS: Should be pureed with no chunks and about the consistency of thick honey. All canned food should be natural color, no coloring added.

DRIED FOODS: Color characteristic and shape are important. Jar should contain little amount of air and have vegetables that are brittle and fruits that are bendable and leathery.

4. All articles or collections must be cleaned, the paint and glue dry and ready to be placed on exhibit before entering.
5. Please note that professionals, (anyone making a living by making or selling crafts), are not allowed.
6. All collections must have 12 or more items except Modeled Craft collections, which must contain five (5) or more items. Mounted collections may not be larger than 24" x 24".
7. Repeat entries from previous years will NOT be accepted. The Fair is NOT responsible for loss or breakage.
